

PARTNERSHIP SCOPING

- **This tool has been designed for the early stages of a partnership to highlight the green growth challenge, identify the barriers and articulate the partnership solution.**

- **The tool will be useful for internal and external communication but also to ensure that collaboration is the best means to address the issue and that the partnership intervention creates significant change.**

- **Using this tool is an iterative process and responses to these questions are likely to evolve over time as research is completed and new information emerges.**

1	Frame the challenge What are the issues that demand solutions to make green growth a reality?
What is the problem or issue?	
What is the level of analysis? Is this a global, regional or local issue? Is it about specific sectors or supply chains?	
Which Sustainable Development Goals does your partnership aim to tackle? How does this problem relate to multiple goals / what are the linkages?

For example;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Awareness and behavioural failures where there is a lack of consumer or business awareness of the issue or difficulty in changing entrenched behaviours <input type="checkbox"/> Policy failures where there is a lack of regulatory frameworks to support change <input type="checkbox"/> Capital failures where there is a lack of access to the capital necessary for implementation <input type="checkbox"/> Technology failures where the technology to pursue the opportunity is still immature <input type="checkbox"/> Coordination failures where there is insufficient market participation or infrastructure to support change <input type="checkbox"/> Other barriers

<p>Do the barriers require joint, coordinated action? Why is a partnership approach necessary?</p>	
<p>Have conventional project approaches been used to address the barriers? Are there other ways to address the barriers?</p>	

4	Ensuring success How can the proposed partnership reinforce existing efforts and maximise impact?
Does the partnership solution resonate with others? Will it effectively tackle the critical barriers? How good is the supporting data?	
What has previously been done? Are there existing partnerships around this issue? What can be learned from existing approaches?	
Who are the winners and losers from this solution? What are the potential adverse consequences from this approach? <input type="checkbox"/> Rebound effects <input type="checkbox"/> Trade barriers <input type="checkbox"/> Inefficiently deployed capital	

5	Partnership scale and impact How will the partnership operate at the most effective scale?
What kind of potential scale and impact is envisioned for this solution? Is scale implicit in the initial design or will successful pilots / approaches be scaled over time?	
How will the partnership scale up? <input type="checkbox"/> Technology advance, solutions pay for themselves' and become competitive in relation to less green options. <input type="checkbox"/> Regulation, a critical mass of support for regulations which internalise environmental externalities. <input type="checkbox"/> Norm changes, become adopted through changes in consumption patterns or mobilisation of social movements.	
What might potential tipping points be? What might be sparked between technological, economic, political and social change?
