3GF touches on numerous partnerships through regional events, the Summits, broader advocacy and outreach. Many of these partnerships participate in the 3GF process but may not have evolved past an initial conversation. Some partnerships may still be at early stages of partnership development or may have already wrapped up. Please find below some examples of such partnerships:

- **Public Private Partnerships on green financing:** commits to collaborating closely with the UK government Capital Markets Climate Initiative platform, and to communicating lessons, particularly around renewable energy (*3GF 2011*).
- **Electric Vehicle Test Markets:** develops and implements a strategy with framework conditions for an Electric Vehicle test market that addresses issues related to enhancing business and consumer incentives and recharging infrastructure (*3GF 2011*).
- **C40 Cities and Green Growth:** promote best practices to cities around the world on how cities, the private sector and knowledge institutions can work together to attract investments and create jobs while addressing environmental challenges (*3GF 2012*).
- **Energy Efficiency Indicators (Motor Systems):** explores energy efficiency indicators in the area of motor systems to promote the rapid deployment of EE measures and guide effective policy measures (*3GF 2012*).
- **Bio-based Growth:** accelerates a transition to a bio-based economy with the aim of accelerating innovation and research, boosting market uptake and public awareness of bio-based products (*3GF 2012*).
- **Smart Cities:** works with cities and private sector suppliers to accelerate the development and deployment of smart technologies for water (*3GF 2013*).
- **Phase 1: Urban Water Leakages: Learning Network:** aims to scale up water saving solutions in rapidly growing cities through performance based contracts, where technology providers are paid through the savings they create (*3GF 2013*).
- **Innovation to Transform Food Production:** aims to transform how food is produced through a clearing house that analyses best practices and explores opportunities for scale through collaboration, cooperation and prioritization (*3GF 2014*).
- **Biomass Platform:** promotes dialogue between governments, companies and other biomass users and guides the transition to a bio-based economy (*3GF Africa 2015 marketplace*).
- **Mobilising green growth finance:** mobilizes and connects public and private finance to the priorities of green growth by creating a green growth themed private equity fund and a framework for an innovative financing mechanism for green growth (*3GF Summit partnership café, scoping*).
- **SUSTAIN Africa:** facilitates work among communities, businesses, governments, civil society organizations and development partners to achieve sustainable and inclusive green growth, food security and climate resilience (*3GF Africa 2015 marketplace, 3GF Summit partnership café*).
- **Sustainable Livestock Initiative:** reconciles production with conservation. A multi-stakeholder approach to greening the intensive livestock system and addressing the challenge of responsible beef production in South America. (*3GF LAC 2015 marketplace*).
- **Urban Water Nexus:** explores opportunities for smarter action around water and energy use by taking a nexus approach and maximizing impact through effective data management. (*3GF 2015 LAC marketplace*).
- **Green growth and liveability cities:** explores how to combine growth and sustainability with more healthy and liveable cities for all people through urban leadership, integrated planning, innovation and impact (*scoping*).

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
